Call to Order

1. Prayer

Commissioner White led the Court in prayer to begin the meeting.

This allows TAC to email our employees the IRS forms needed associated with the Affordable Care Act without cost to the County. The other alternatives all add costs for the County.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Frye to approve the renewal agreement, seconded by Commissioner Wilkins, the motion passed with a majority vote. See attached.


8. Consider and Discuss Matters Concerning the Parmer County Law Enforcement Center
