When the following was had and done, To-wit:

Call to Order

1. Prayer

Commissioner Frye led the Court in prayer to begin the meeting.

2. Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and the Texas Flag

The Court pledged their allegiance to the flags of the United States of America and the State of Texas.

3. Open Forum for Public Comments

Faith Tyler from APEX gave an update on the Lariat West windmill project. She discussed that APEX signed a Mitigation Agreement with DOD on August 13, 2025. The federal government has yet to respond. APEX met with Jodey Arrington to seek his help in moving the Agreement

forward. She is requesting a letter from the Commissioners' Court in support of this. Judge Carrasco assured her that this would be done.

4. Approve Minutes from Previous Meeting

Upon a motion to approve the minutes from the Regular Meeting on February 24, 2026, by Commissioner White, seconded by Commissioner Frye, the motion passed by a majority vote.

5. Consider Approval and Payment of Accounts Payable-Sharon May

Sharon May reported the Accounts Payable List for invoices for March 4th and 10th. Motion by Commissioner Frye, seconded by Commissioner Wilkins to approve Payment of the Accounts Payable as presented. Motion carried by majority vote. See attached.

6. Consider Treasurer's Payroll Report-Sharon May

Commissioner White made the motion to approve the Treasurer's Payroll Report for February 27, 2026, Commissioner Wilkins seconded and the motion passed by majority vote. See attached.

7. Review the 2026 Joint Primary Election

Jessica White, Election Administrator, presented the precinct by precinct results to the Court. Since the posting of the results on election night on the website were unable to be seen by many computers, a discussion was held on how to better inform the public of the results.

8. Consider and Discuss Time Clock Implementation Services (10 prepaid hours)

Sharon May discussed the fact that TCP wanted more implementation hours added because the interface with NetData (i3Verticals) is not yet working.

A discussion was held on the fact that the Judge and Treasurer were told that the time system could handle our payment with Sheriff office hours as well as courthouse employees' hours but at present it is not able to do that.

Judge Carrasco made a motion to pay for 10 additional hours; Commissioner Frye seconded. A vote was held and the motion did not pass with 2 aye votes and 2 nay votes.

9. Consider and Discuss Burn Ban

Commissioner Frye made a motion to continue the burn ban for 90 days. Commissioner Wilkins seconded and the motion passed on a majority vote.

10. Discuss SB 22 Compliance Report

Judge Carrasco stated that this report has been filed with the Comptroller. After the filing it was brought to the Judge's attention that the salary for the Sheriff was incorrect. The incorrect filing was due to the fact the monthly payroll reports for the Sheriff were incorrect.

The Judge expressed his desire for reports with his signature and sent to the state be correct prior to his signing.

11. Consider and Discuss Matters Concerning the Parmer County Law Enforcement Center

A. Jail Roster



B. Asset Forfeiture


The Sheriff presented the Asset Forfeiture Report for 2025. See attached.
