Call to Order

1. Prayer

Commissioner White led the Court in prayer to begin the meeting.

2. Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and the Texas Flag

The Court pledged their allegiance to the flags of the United States of America and the State of Texas.

3. Open Forum for Public Comments

No one present had comments.

4. Approve Minutes from Previous Meeting

Upon a motion to approve the minutes from the Regular Meeting on June 9, 2026, by Commissioner Frye, seconded by Commissioner White, the motion passed by a majority vote.

5. Consider Approval and Payment of Accounts Payable-Sharon May

Sharon May reported the Accounts Payable List for invoices for June 16 and 23rd Motion by Commissioner White, seconded by Commissioner Wilkins to approve Payment of the Accounts Payable as presented. Motion carried by majority vote. See attached.

6. Consider Treasurer's Payroll Report-Sharon May

Commissioner Frye made the motion to approve the Treasurer's Payroll Report for June 15, 2026, Commissioner White seconded and the motion passed by majority vote. See attached.

7. Discuss Consider and Discuss Renewal Bonds for Breann Saenz, Sonia Gomez, Teresa Cary, Roxann Jenkins and City of Friona

Bonds were presented for approval for the three County Deputies in various offices. The bonds for Sonia Gomez and the City of Friona were not presented. Commissioner White made a motion to approve the renewal bonds for the courthouse deputies. Commissioner Wilkins seconded and the motion passed by majority vote. Bonds for Sonia Gomez and City of Friona will be brought to the Court for approval when they are received.

8. Consider and Discuss VIPRE Antivirus Subscription for Courthouse

Robert Goff, Newtex IT Solutions has presented the County with a renewal for VIPRE antivirus subscription. This is renewed yearly. This has increased in cost from last year. This is a renewal but moves to (EDR) Endpoint Detection & Response which strengthens our protection.

Commissioner Wilkins made a motion to approve the renewal of VIPRE, Commissioner White seconded and the motion passed with a majority vote.

9. Consider and Discuss Continuing Education Hours for Tax Assessor

Upon a motion from Commissioner Frye to approve the continuing education hours, seconded by Commissioner White, the motion passed with a majority vote. See attached document.

10. Consider and Discuss Penny Shortage Cash Policy for Tax Assessor

Awyna Sanchez informed the Court that the discontinuation of minting pennies is affecting the Tax-Assessor office. One of the permits is \$82.42 and must be paid in cash. The office has no pennies and the bank

have none available for their customers. She has presented a sign to address this to the public in this office. See attached.

The public can donate their change back to three entities. They will not receive that change back if it is less than \$.05 as there is no available pennies for change back.

On a motion by Commissioner White to allow the Tax-Assessor to enact this process, seconded by Commissioner Wilkins, the motion passed by majority vote.

11. Consider and Discuss Continuing Education Hours for JP3

Upon a motion from Commissioner Frye to approve the continuing education hours, seconded by Commissioner Wilkins, the motion passed with a majority vote. See attached document.

12. Consider and Discuss Matters Concerning the Parmer County Law Enforcement Center

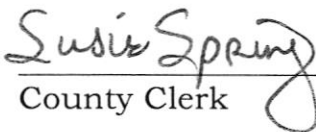
A. Jail Roster

The Sheriff reported 34 inmates housed in the Parmer County Jail. 12 are from Lamb County, 4 are from Floyd County, 1 is from Cochran County and 17 are Parmer County inmates.

Sheriff Geske reported that in the past few months, his office has billed \$200,000 dollars for housing other counties inmates.

Treasurer Sharon May reminded the Court that on July 7th there will be a Healthy County Event for employees at 10 AM and 1:30 PM.
